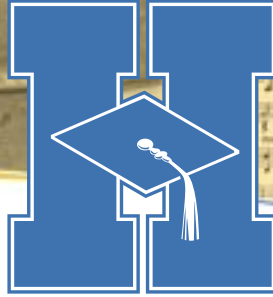

## Gowans Stadium renovations underway

April 26, 2004 brought a ground-breaking ceremony for the renovation of Gowans Stadium. The track is being widened to eight lanes in order to accommodate sanctioned high school and college meets. The football field will change from grass to a synthetic surface to avoid the wear that would otherwise occur from the high number of HHS junior varsity, varsity and HCC games played at Gowans. Four tennis courts have been eliminated to make room for a retention pond to eliminate drainage problems that have plagued the HCC campus. ## Underground Salt Museum breaks ground

The Kansas Underground Salt Museum had an "Underground Breaking" ceremony on April 12, 2004. This attraction will be the only one of its kind in the western hemisphere and will feature more than 100,000 square feet of exhibit and programming space 650 feet below ground in a working salt mine. A conference center, educational rooms for school groups and adult education opportunities, three educational theatres and a traveling exhibit gallery are also part of the plans. The project is in the midst of a \$7.8 million dollar capital campaign, and the facility is scheduled to open in the Fall of 2005.
